- 2. What is organic compared to geometric? Irregular and informal shapes and marks
- 3. What does painterly mean? Brushstrokes are evident and important
- 4. What are COLOR FIELD paintings?: Large flat areas of color with distinct edges
- 5. ABSTRACT EXPRESSIONISM got its name because it was
 - a. abstract: nonobjective, actually
 - b. Expressive: stressing individual feelings
 - ...rather than.... design or formal qualities

The Expressive Language: Chapter 10, page 201, Discovering Drawing textbook

- 1. What is an AESTHETIC RESPONSE? An intense emotional response to an artwork
- 2. EXPRESSIVE POSSIBILITIES: Many expressive drawings have abstract qualities that take the viewer beyond observation into... experience, emotion, imagination, & personal or cultural symbolism.
- 3. ABSTRACT and NONOBJECTIVE ART: What does abstract art stress? Stresses the form of the subject matter rather than its actual appearance
- 4. What is NON-OBJECTIVE art?: Did not show any recognizable object at all
- 5. MEANINGFUL COLOR: Philosophers think about how we find colors meaningful. Colors are...**powerful**Colors can also be...**symbolic, with meanings that change from culture to culture.**
